

Saugeen First Nation Employment & Training Centre

Employment & Training Office- offers a variety of programs year round. In the summer months it provides summer students to gain work experience in various departments from maintenance to office administration. They are also the contact for Huronia for on-reserve community members looking for financial support

Youth Work Experience Program- provides young adults with the hopes of them being driven, hard-working, and dependable. This program keeps them in a consistent work schedule once they get out of high school and hopefully they take the information they learned and put it to use in their future endeavors.

Forestry Program- works with Economic Development, Lands and Leasing, Ontario Works, Employment and Training, and Works department ensuring the program is successful and giving employment to community members looking to improve Saugeen First Nation. Providing firewood to community members who use firewood as a heating source.

Amphitheatre Program- provides community members who are interested in working with their hands and learning valuable work experience in drystone masonry. Through the program community members can obtain career certification levels (Drystone Mason level 1, Journeyman Mason level 2, and Master Craftsmen level 3). Ultimately working to improve the image of the Saugeen Amphitheatre. Maintaining & rebuilding the Amphitheatre in years to come.

Amphitheatre Grounds Crew- this program is seasonal employment from June-October. They provide general grounds keeping, event preparation and clean up, flower planting. de-weeding garden beds, watering plants are just some of the many jobs that are done by this program. Also providing general information to visiting guests about Saugeen first Nation. Weddings & other events.

Huronia Area Aboriginal Management Board- provides support and Aboriginal employment training initiatives that help to give community members the opportunities for empowerment and self-sufficiency. Alter-Abled Initiative, Community Youth Forum, Direct Course Purchase, Employment Assistance Support Measure, Incarcerated Transitions, Job Creation Partnership, Local Labour Market Partnerships, Mobility Assistance, Small Business- Purchase of Training, Small Business Support Program, Stay-In-School Initiative.

Science & Technology- This program is provided on weekends in the winter months for students. Students get to experience a variety traditional hunting & trapping, snow shoeing, native craft making, and general survival skills.

Computer Lab- is provided to community members and is meant for educational and employment purposes only. There are 12 desktop units with access to internet, printing services, resume and cover letter workshops are provided. Wi-Fi is available throughout the building.

Theory & Drafting rooms- Theory room has a capacity of 20 people and the Drafting room has a capacity of 25 people. These rooms can be booked through the Employment and Training for the purposes of training and for meetings.

Woodshop- From making small wood working to custom made projects.
